<b>Tell us about any previous work experience you have and the skills you have that make you a good candidate for this programme.</b>	Able to speak confidently of previous experiences and the applicant confidently runs through various existing skills.	Good examples given of previous experience and the applicant confidently runs through various existing skills.	Can provide different examples of relevant experience but not able to go into too much detail on the subject.	Able to give very few examples or expand on those given.	Unable to offer any supporting details of previous work experience, useful skills or personal experience that has prepared them for this opportunity.
<b>How do you think this experience will benefit your future career?</b>	Have a clear idea of the potential benefits of the programme in relation to their employability.	Showed a good level of understanding, providing examples that clearly demonstrate prior thought.	Able to give examples of potential benefits but doesn't elaborate in any detail.	Shows only a vague understanding of the various benefits of taking part.	Doesn't elaborate on how they feel the opportunity will help with future career aspirations.
<b>What type of internship role are you looking for, what responsibilities are you expecting to have on place and what skills are you looking to practice during the remote internship?</b>	The perfect fit with many of our opportunities, also flexible and open-minded regarding expectations.	Looking for the type of opportunities that are available and their skills would suit them.	Could be a possible fit with a host company but may need a little pre-programme assistance if expectations are difficult to meet.	Specific expectations that may be a little difficult to accommodate. <b>If successful, what potential challenges do you think you could face during your remote internship?</b>	Realistic about potential challenges, honest and has clearly thought about how to handle potential difficulties. Well thought through answer, has done some research but still some concerns or red flags about the programme.
